Berkley Park, Kansas City, MO

1 WHEREAS the city of Kansas was established on the bank of the Missouri River, part of North
 2 America’s longest river system;
 3 AND WHEREAS, that same river carried native peoples, the Lewis and Clark Expedition, steam boat
 4 loads of settlers and goods to and past the location that would become today’s Kansas City;
 5 AND WHEREAS, that Great River is enjoyed by some individuals and groups of anglers, paddlers,
 6 power boaters, hikers and cyclists, but is largely unused and unappreciated by the majority of Kansas
 7 City;
 8 AND WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Kansas City has control over significant land along that river,
 9 including Berkley Riverfront Park, and is in the process of redesigning its uses;
 10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Conservation Federation of Missouri assembled at
 11 the Lodge of Four Seasons, Lake Ozark, MO, this 26th day of February, 2006, encourages the Port
 12 Authority of Kansas City to focus its redesign of Berkley Park and its surroundings toward the
 13 environmentally responsible use of and appreciation for the Missouri River that has nurtured the city
 14 from its earliest beginnings.
