### Student Conservation Organization

1 WHEREAS, Missouri’s high schools as a whole are lacking in the education of conservation;  
 2 AND WHEREAS, high school is an important developmental stage of future conservation leaders for  
 3 Missouri’s natural resources;  
 4 AND WHEREAS, providing students with natural resources related extracurricular activities will  
 5 enhance their awareness and involvement in conservation practices;  
 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Conservation Federation of Missouri assembled at  
 7 the Lodge of Four Seasons, this 26th day of February, 2006, encourages the Missouri Cooperative  
 8 Extension Service to sponsor two conservation organization pilot programs in both urban and rural  
 9 areas in order to educate high school students in conserving the state’s natural resources through  
 10 first-hand activities. We recommend that the Missouri Cooperative Extension Service collaborate with  
 11 State (e.g. Missouri Department of Conservation), federal (e.g. United States Fish and Wildlife Service),  
 12 and non-government organizations (e.g. Boy Scouts) to develop and deliver such a program to  
 13 Missouri’s high school systems.
