David Risberg held a B.S. in Wildland Soils and Watershed Management from Humboldt State University and was actively involved in a variety of habitat improvement projects throughout his lifetime.

David died at the age of 34 in an automobile accident in January of 2017. He was an avid outdoorsman with a love of hunting and fishing, and an abiding interest in the preservation, conservation and management of natural resources.

This Fund was established as a means of honoring his dedication to these pursuits by enabling Affiliates of the Conservation Federation of Missouri to fund conservation and education projects with annual grants.



## **Awarding the Risberg Memorial Affiliate Grants:**

These grants are awarded by the Conservation Federation of Missouri in honor of David A. Risberg. Only CFM affiliated organizations are eligible to apply.

The purpose of these grants is to provide an opportunity for affiliates to implement conservation projects supported in whole or in part through this fund.

## **Projects are based around the following areas:**

Provide support for implementing a conservation project.

Provide an opportunity for people to take action on a conservation issue or to grow the conservation movement.

Provide support enabling an affiliate to implement a conservation program, project or campaign to advance conservation priorities.

In 1935, sportsmen from throughout Missouri came together to form the Conservation Federation of Missouri (CFM). Their initiative petition campaign resulted in the creation of the Missouri Department of Conservation, a non-political conservation agency that has been a model for other states.

Today CFM is the largest and most representative conservation group in Missouri. It is a citizen's organization with over 90 affiliate organizations and thousands of members. CFM is the Missouri affiliate of the National Wildlife Federation.
