



CFM Resolution Process

Issues for consideration are introduced by CFM leaders, members, and affiliates.

Issues may be submitted to the Executive Director for assignment to the appropriate Resource Advisory Committee, or independently determined by the Resource Advisory Committee chair.

Resource Advisory Committees vote to pre-file resolutions with the Resolutions Committee. If a resolution fails to pass, it is dead.

Resolutions Committee votes to accept/reject pre-filed resolutions. Accepted resolutions move back to the Resource Advisory Committee.

Resource Advisory Committee considers amendments and a vote during convention. If a resolution passes, it returns to the Resolutions Committee to be considered for final docket to the General Assembly.

If a resolution passes the General Assembly, it becomes part of CFM's official policy platform.
